Committee Reports

Mayor — Tina Wetter

Police Department. Ordinance 2017-10 & 2017-11. Tonight the Township is introducing an ordinance to establish a procedure for promotions to the position of Chief of Police. This is the first step in filling this position. After the second reading and public hearing in September, the process can begin. The Township will continue working with the New Jersey Chief's Association for the process.

Also on tonight's agenda is the ordinance implementing the proposed rules and regulations provided by the Township's Accreditation Consultant, the Rodgers Group. These will replace the rules and regulations adopted in 1993. This is also a part of the Police Accreditation process.

National Night Out took place on Tuesday, August 1, 2017, was very well attended and was a great community night out. Everyone had a great time. I would like to thank all the volunteers and staff that assisted in making it another successful event.

Mayor Wetter's remaining report below was submitted to Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio for the record.

Ordinance 2017-9, 2nd Reading, Public Hearing. The Township is adopting a refunding bond ordinance tonight. It will refinance bonds that have been paid down and will be a cost savings to the Township. This will also include the Township having a Financial Advisor complete a bond rating, which will be beneficial to the Township for this bond refunding and with permanent financing.

Resolution 2017-263 through 2017-266. The resolutions on the agenda tonight are bonds from the New Jersey Infrastructure Trust Financing program, which are being renewed pursuant to the 2018 NJEIT program. The program requires that resolutions be completed for loan and bond agreements. These are for the water and sewer projects in the Pebble Beach section of town.

Resolutions 2017-269 and 2017-273. The Township of Ocean Police Department has received a grant award for the "Cops in Shops" program, a grant from the State of New Jersey Department of Law & Public Safety in the amount of \$2,000.00. Resolution 2017-273 authorizes the insertion of this item of revenue into the 2017 Budget. The Police Department has received a grant from Emergency Management Agency Assistance Grant. This is the second year the Township of Ocean has received this grant in the amount of \$9,400. This grant supplements Emergency Management salaries and/or overtime that incur while acting in the capacity of the Office of Emergency Management. Resolution 2017-269 authorizes the insertion of this item of revenue into the 2017 Budget.

Deputy Mayor — Dan Collamer

Oyster Creek/Exelon Shut Down. On Monday August 7, 2017 Deputy Mayor Collamer and Township Administrator/Clerk Diane Ambrosio attended a meeting regarding the decommissioning of the Oyster Creek Power Plant, along with members of the Lacey Township Committee, Ocean County Freeholders, 9th Legislative District, and Congressman MacArthur's office. The plant was opened in December 1969 and will close in December 2019.

This meeting is the first of a series of annual meetings that will take place as the process unfolds. Closer to the closing, there will be more people and public involved at those meetings. The overall goal is to provide for a safe and smooth transition, from an operating site to a permanently shut down site.

Resolution 2017-262. This resolution denies a request for a Long Term Tax Exemption (PILOT) program for the Tradewinds at Waretown project. This project is an apartment complex that has only 29 affordable apartments and 115 market rate units along with commercial space. This project will be paying regular taxes, just like everyone else.

Resolution 2017-272. This resolution authorizes a person to person liquor license transfer from Longshots Bar and Restaurant to Breakers Kitchen and Tap, LLC. They have completed all the necessary paperwork and have passed the background check. The liquor license will now be active.

Construction & Zoning. Tractor Supply is still moving along in the state. They have obtained one of the necessary Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) permits. The applicant needs one additional DEP permit (wetlands) and one Department of Transportation (DOT) access permit. Once the permits are granted, the project will be moving forward.

The annual Town Wide Yard Sale was a huge success, with over 90 houses signed up to be placed on the map and approximately 30 tables at the lake.

The Township's Recreation Summer program at the Waretown Elementary School was also a great success this year averaging almost 65 children each day.

Committeeman — Ben LoParo

Ordinance 2017-12. The Township Committee is introducing an ordinance requiring a security deposit to rent the Community Center. This does not apply to Non-Profit organizations or

Senior Groups using the center at this time. The security deposit will be \$100.00 for each event or rental. The security deposit will be returned if no damage occurs.

Poplar Street Pump Station Rehabilitation. The contractor has completed the work on Poplar Street. The road was opened today for traffic. The project is still ongoing.

Volunteer Way Update. The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has responded to the Township's request for relief on all the snake tunnels and the bulkhead material to build the road. The DEP will require more studies. A meeting will be setup with the DEP to discuss these items further.

A drainage complaint on Letts Landing Road has been fixed in-house by the Department of Public Works. There have also been drainage issues on Keelson Drive. The Department of Public Works will be out next week to complete drainage work in that area.

The School Board was shorted \$139,000 from State Aid. The budget was retooled and there will be no impact on the students from losing that money.

PUBLIC PORTION:

Mary Dunkley, Marine Road, inquired if the School Board shortage will impact residents.

Committeeman LoParo discussed the shortage was for State Aid. The State Aid was decreased, but the Teaching Assistance grants were increased. There is zero effect on the residents.

Eileen Doyle, 243 11'11 Street, discussed there was a double yellow line at the S-curve on 11'1' Street, before the water/sewer project began.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed the Township has video of the street before the project. There were no lines on the street before the project.

Mrs. Doyle discussed people buzz around the S-curve and suggested lines be painted.

Committeeman LoParo inquired if the lines could be painted in-house.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed the Township does not have a line machine.

Mayor Wetter inquired if Barnegat has a line machine.

Township Administrator/Clerk Ambrosio discussed Barnegat paints them by hand.

Robert Lahm, 67 Johnson Street, inquired there is an update on the Wyckoff property. The situation has gotten worse.

Deputy Mayor Collamer discussed the Township has taken the Wyckoff's to court and they were given 30 days to obtain the necessary permits to do the repairs to make the house habitable. From the day of the decision, they have 60 days to complete the repairs and obtain a Certificate of Occupancy. That timeline has expired. A grace period has been given until August 14, 2017. If no Certificate of Occupancy has been obtained by August 14, 2017, the Township Attorney will take the issue back to court for the judge to make a decision.

Township Attorney McGuckin discussed the judge gave the resident time to comply. The resident has not complied. This gives the Township the opportunity to go back to the judge.
